



What Exams Will Students Take

Middle School

- Grades 6-8
 - <u>FAST</u> (Florida Assessments for Student Thinking)
 - Subjects tested: Reading Comprehension & Math
 - 1 session in 1 day
 - All computer-based exams
 - *Grade 8 ONLY- Science Statewide Assessment will be administered in one day. 8th grade students taking Physical Science will have to take exam.
 - End-of Course Assessments (EOC)
 - Algebra I EOC
 - Geometry EOC
 - Biology EOC
 - Civics EOC

ASSESSMENTS MUST BE TAKEN IN PERSON. NO REMOTE TESTING APPROVED BY THE FLDOE

What Exams Will Students Take

High School

- Grades 9 & 10
 - <u>FAST</u> (Florida Assessments for Student Thinking)
 - Subjects tested: Reading Comprehension
 - 1 session in 1 day
 - Computer based exam
 - End-of Course Assessments (EOC)
 - Algebra I EOC
 - Geometry EOC
 - Biology EOC
 - US History EOC
 - FCLE

ASSESSMENTS MUST BE TAKEN IN PERSON. NO REMOTE TESTING APPROVED BY THE FLDOE

EOCs 30% Rule

- ALL EOC assessment results make up 30% of student's overall grade for the following courses:
 - Biology EOC
 - Civics EOC
 - US History EOC
 - Algebra I EOC
 - Algebra I is a Pass/Fail AND counts as 30% of the overall grade
 - Geometry EOC
- Students must earn a passing grade in a course with 30% calculation applied in order to earn high school credit for the course

Florida Civic Literacy Exam (FCLE)

- Computer-Based Exam
- Administered only to Seniors
- Testing Window: April 17-May 26
- Students must go in person to a testing site to take the assessment
- Passing score: 60% or higher
- Fall FCLE scores can be found on the FL Family Portal
- If student does not take/pass the FCLE they will need to take it at the post-secondary level

Students will test 3 times per year to monitor student progress

PM1: Beginning of school year

PM2: Mid-year

PM3: End of school year

PM1 & PM2 are informal assessments, completed during class time

*Remote testing available

PM3: Formal evaluation used for school accountability

*ONLY IN PERSON testing available

FAST Mathematics:

- Students will have access to a calculator during the entire exam
 - Grade 6: four function calculator
 - Grades 7 & 8: Scientific Calculator

Grades 3-10 ELA Reading	90 minutes	120 Minutes
Grades 6-8 Mathematics	100 Minutes	120 Minutes

B.E.S.T. Writing assessment will be implemented next school year

B.E.S.T. Algebra I & Geometry End-of-Course Assessments

- All students enrolled in one in these courses must participate in the appropriate assessment
- Assessment score counts as 30% of student's final course grade
- Algebra I EOC remains a graduation requirement. Students must pass the assessment
 - Students will have opportunities to retake assessment if they do not pass it
- Administered as a Computer-Based Test
- Students will receive reference sheets
- Students will be able to bring and use a handheld calculator.
- Handheld calculators must be from the FLDOE approved scientific calculator list
- Administered in one 160-minute session, but may continue working if they need additional time

What is staying the same?

- Students must pass the Algebra I EOC in order to graduate
- Students must pass the 10th Grade FAST ELA Reading exam in order to graduate
- 8th grade Science Statewide Assessment
- Civics EOC
- Biology EOC
- US History EOC
- FCLE (Florida Civic Literacy Exam)
- Testing window- entire month of May

*Every school will determine exam dates within testing window. As soon as test dates are finalized you will receive an email with detailed information.


Scale Scores

Testing Reminders

- Arrive to testing site no later than 7:20am and report to the Main Office.
- Bring school ID or a Government issued ID.
- Students <u>MUST</u> wear full school uniform. Students without full uniform will not be allowed into building
 - Polo with virtual school logo or a plain white polo
 - Khaki or navy blue pants only- NO JEANS
- Bring #2 pencils.
- Sweaters are highly recommended.
- Bring snacks, lunch and water
- Electronic devices are grounds for invalidation
- <u>Dismissal from school</u>: Parent/guardian must pick up the student. If someone else is picking up the student, they must send an e-mail to Ms. Iglesias prior to test date for approval.
